Scott William Delfa of Granville, NY, formerly of Purdys, NY, passed away on September 9, 2019, at the age of 56. Mr. Delfa was born in 1963, in Yonkers, NY, to James and Barbara Delfa. He graduated from Walter Panas High School in 1981, later earning a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from the John Jay College of Criminal Justice. Mr. Delfa worked as a Correction Officer for the Westchester County Department of Correction in Valhalla, NY, before retiring in June, 2019. 
